We're grateful for her leadership and support throughout her 10+ years of service, and particularly during the spring and summer of 2020, when she mobilized the Caring Circle to check in by phone with nearly every member of our congregation during a difficult time for us all. If you do not know about the Caring Circle, let us share it with you! The Caring Circle is a group that responds when our members experience special needs and challenges due to illness, birth/adoption, death, and other life changes. The impact of these challenges can be eased by our caring for one another, person to person, family to family.

To join the Caring Circle, just complete the simple form on the church website (<u>http://www.uucantonny.org/get-involved/caring-circle/</u>). New Caring Circle members indicate which caring actions they would be willing to provide when needs arise. This might be helping with transportation to a doctor's appointment, bringing a meal to a family, or helping with a memorial service reception. It can be as simple as sending a card to someone having a tough time. When a request arises for the type of need you have offered help with, you will receive an email from the Caring Circle coordinators. Please be assured that when you are contacted about a need, you are free to decline if the timing of the request is not good.

If you or another church member has a "Caring-Circle-type" need, please contact Caring Circle Coordinators Eden Terrell or Valerie Ingram (their contact information is in the church directory or email <u>caringcircle@uucantonny.org</u>). A MESSAGE FROM OUR SOCIAL JUSTICE COORDINATOR
