## A Factoid from the Environmental Action Committee

Did you know...

That the Paris Climate negotiations in December are expected to produce the first international and legally binding climate treaty?

There are two goals for this treaty: (1) limit future greenhouse gas emissions to result in temperature increase of no more than 2 degrees Celsius in 2100 (relative to 1900); and (2) generate a Climate Fund of \$100 billion to support developing countries efforts. The current US appropriations bill includes \$500 million toward this fund.
